OUR CONTAINER GROWN PLANTS ARE EASY TO PLANT AND READY TO GROW.

A step by step approach to planting:

1. Upon receipt of plants unpack immediately and water containers thoroughly — if possible leave to soak for a time in some suitable receptacle. Your plants will now be ready for immediate planting, or can be held for several weeks if suitably fertilised and irrigated.
2. If held for a period before planting always soak containers well before eventual planting.
3. Prepare planting hole before removing plant from container. If the removed soil is excessively clayey, or sandy improve by adding well rotted compost, peat, or one of the prepacked soil mixes now on the market.
4. Carefully break up any hard pan at the bottom of hole with a garden fork and dust with a handful of bonemeal.
5. Before planting carefully remove the plastic container without unduly disturbing the root system. Soaking helps in removal of container.
6. If the stronger growing roots have started to spiral around in the container carefully tease out and unravel.
7. Set plant carefully into the prepared hole and onto a pad of good humusy soil.

8. If a stake is considered necessary insert at this stage as close to the main stem as can be obtained and doing as little damage to root system as possible.
9. Back fill around root ball with your prepared soil mixture, tucking and firming soil down with fingers and clenched fist. Before completely filling hole with soil leave a gap and soak thoroughly with a bucket of water laced with one of the liquid seaweed formulations. This application will remove any airpockets you may have left around the root system.
10. Top planting hole up with soil leaving a slight depression to hold future irrigation water.
11. **Pay very careful attention to watering throughout the summer months** and if necessary shade plant from excessive strong sunlight or strong winds.
12. Mulching root areas with peat, or rotted unantalsised sawdust helps to retain moisture and provide for a cool root run. Remember to draw the mulching material back from the root area before irrigating, replacing immediately afterwards.
13. Fertilizer — Some four to six weeks after planting rake in a handful of good general fertilizer over the root area. Irrigating thoroughly immediately after this action. It is often beneficial to most plants after planting to spray leaves lightly with liquid fertilizer at approximately two-weekly intervals. This helps to feed plant until root system is ready to forage for food.

NOTE:—The majority of Australian and South African trees and shrubs DO NOT require fertilizer applications either before or after planting.

- ACACIA BAILEYANA PURPUREA** — Purple Cootamundra Wattle \$2.50 ea.
Neat small growing tree with fern-like purplish foliage covered in fragrant lemon-yellow flowers in late winter.
- ACACIA PRAVISSIMA** — Alpine Wattle \$2.50 ea.
A small tree with distinctive foliage displaying long sprays of golden flowers in season.
- AGONIS FLEXUOSA** — Australian Weeping Willow Myrtle \$2.80 ea.
Rapid growing small tree with attractive weeping habit. Willow-like foliage bronzy-red in spring turning green.
- AGONIS JUNIPERINA** — Australian Juniper Myrtle \$2.80 ea.
Rapid growing small tree with small foliage and masses of white flowers in winter. Good cut flowers.
- CEDRUS ATLANTICA GLAUCA** — Blue Atlas Cedar \$12.00 ca.
A beautiful spreading conifer displaying silvery-blue foliage all the year round. Large specimen grade.
- CEDRUS DEODARA AUREA** — Golden Himalayan Cedar \$12.00 ea.
A slow growing conifer with grey-green foliage yellow at the tips, horizontal branches weep attractively at the tips. Large specimen grade.

Fast growing coastal tree with glossy green foliage margined silver.

As above, but with glossy green foliage having a wide yellow margin.

Another fine lawn specimen. An upright tapering tree with long, narrow, serrated leaves and red-brown coloured flowers in November. Flowers are much beloved by native bird life as a ready source of nectar. Very wind hardy tree and recommended for coastal planting.
- LIQUIDAMBER STYRACIFLUA** — \$3.50 ea.
A beautiful hardy deciduous lawn specimen tree with shining green maple-like foliage, which becomes a gorgeous orange-crimson red pyramid in the autumn.

A new Australian introduction with attractive gold edged foliage in summer, assuming delightful autumn colourings before leaf fall.

MAGNOLIA CAMPBELLII —	\$8.50 ea.

MAGNOLIA SARGENTIANA ROBUSTA —	\$8.50 ea.
Hardy deciduous tree of medium size from W. China, which when established provides a superb display of immense rosy-pink flowers.	
MAGNOLIA SPRENGERI DIVA —	\$8.50 ea.
A small to medium hardy deciduous tree bearing crops of fragrant flowers of dark rose-pink in early September.	
MAGNOLIA GRANDIFLORA GOLIATH —	\$8.50 ea.
An evergreen magnolia of medium size, dark glossy green foliage, very large globular creamy white flowers borne at an early age.	
METROSIDEROS EXCELSA — Pohutukawa or N.Z. Christmas Tree	\$4.00 ea.
A large growing evergreen tree which thrives in poor soil and is completely resistant to salt winds and spray. Provides a feast of brilliant deep crimson flowers every summer.	
METROSIDEROS E. AUREA — Yellow-flowered Pohutukawa	\$4.00 ea.
Same as above except for yellow flowers and a smaller growth habit.	
METROSIDEROS KERMADECENSIS — Kermadec Pohutukawa	\$4.00 ea.
The scarlet flowering Pohutukawa from the Kermadec Islands. This tree tends to flower spasmodically throughout the year and is smaller growing than the N.Z. Christmas Tree.	
METROSIDEROS K. GOLD BAND — Variegated Pohutukawa	\$4.50 ea.
Smaller growing pohutukawa with striking foliage — green with a gold edge. A suitable tree for the smaller garden.	
METROSIDEROS K. SUNNINGHILL — Variegated Pohutukawa	\$4.50 ea.
One of our newer hybrids and a really delightful small tree. Beautiful foliage bright apple green splashed lemon-yellow in the centre.	
All the <i>Metrosideros</i> grow well on the coast, but some of the variegated new kinds need some protection from a direct salt spray-laden wind.	
PITTOSPORUM CRASSIFOLIUM — Karo	\$2.80 ea.
A very wind and salt spray hardy small tree recommended for coastal shelter. In season carries a crop of minute chocolate brown scented flowers.	
PITTOSPORUM CRASSIFOLIUM VARIEGATUM — Variegated Karo	\$3.75 ea.
A small growing tree with very lovely creamy-white variegated foliage. Wind and salt hardy, but will not tolerate salt spray to the same extent as the Karo above.

A fast growing medium sized tree with long, narrow, undulate light green leaves. An attractive light foliaged shelter tree.
