<u>AZALEA NAKAHARAE HYBRIDS</u>				
The Nakaharae Hybrids were developed by Mrs. Polly Hill at Barnards Inn Farm in Massachusetts, U.S.A. and are sometimes known as "North Tisbury Hybrids". They are an extremely hardy breed withstanding intense cold and more direct sunlight than most evergreen Azaleas.				
They flower predominantly throughout late spring and early summer from April to July, covering a long flowering season. With a colour range from warm pink through light red to orange red and a bright glowing blood red.				
Habit goes from the extreme prostrate spreading to the dense mounding, but even the tallest growing would not reach over 30-40cm in height. Foliage is evergreen small and delicate in various shades of green that turn bronze and purple in the winter months. Ideally suited to the small or large garden landscape as ground cover or specimen shrubs excellent for the rockery and an interesting subject for the city apartment dweller as a hanging basket plant or patio/balcony tub plant.

1. Definition

"The Company" means Duncan & Davies (UK) Limited.

2. Scope

These terms and conditions apply to all sales of goods by the Company and shall prevail over any inconsistent terms or conditions contained or referred to in the buyer's order or in correspondence or elsewhere unless specifically agreed to in writing by a director of the Company.

3. Quotations

A quotation by the Company does not constitute an offer and the Company reserves the right to withdraw or amend the same at any time prior to the Company's acceptance of the buyer's order.

4. Wholesale Orders

Orders from private individuals cannot be accepted. Advance bookings are "subject to crop" and offers are made "subject unsold".

5. Wholesale Quantities

The Company regrets that orders under £400 will not be accepted as these are uneconomical.

6. Prices and VAT

The prices payable for the goods will be those quoted in the catalogue but the Company reserves the right to make a surcharge should unforeseen cost increases make this necessary. Prices quoted in the catalogue do not include VAT. This is added as a separate total on the invoice.

7. Terms of Payment

(a) Payment of invoices is due within 30 days from the date of the invoice. Interest shall be payable on overdue accounts at the rate of five per cent (5%) per month to run from the due date for payment thereof until receipt by the Company of the full amount whether or not after judgment.

(b) If in the case of any contract or order involving more than one delivery default is made in payment on the due date, the Company shall have the right to suspend all or any further deliveries pending payment or to terminate this Contract in its entirety by notice in writing to the buyer.

8. Cancellations

(a) No cancellation of any order by the buyer in whole or in part or deferment of delivery will be accepted unless agreed in writing by a director of the Company. The Company reserve the right to demand 30% of the order value in the event of cancellation by the buyer.

(b) Whilst every endeavour is made by the Company to keep all nursery stock true to name and free from all pests, virus and other diseases, if before delivery the goods are damaged or found to be diseased the Company may cancel the contract and on refunding any monies paid by the buyer to the Company the Company shall not be under any further liability whatsoever to the buyer.

9. Complaints

(a) The goods must be carefully examined on receipt.

The Company will not be liable to the buyer

(i) for shortages of quantities delivered unless the buyer notifies the Company of any claim for short delivery in writing within 10 days of receipt of the goods

(ii) for damage or loss to the goods or any part thereof in transit (whether goods are carried by the Company's own transport or by a carrier on behalf of the Company) unless the buyer shall notify the Company of any such claim in writing within 10 days of receipt of the goods

(iii) for any loss or damage caused by the act neglect or default of the buyer or any third party.

(b) The Company's liability for plants supplied is limited to replacement of those plants, or at the option of the Company to a refund of any monies paid by the buyer to the Company and upon such replacement or refund the Company shall not be under any further liability whatsoever to the buyer.



10. Ownership of Goods

(a) Title to the goods shall not pass to the buyer until payment in full of the price is received by the Company. Until such payment the buyer shall have possession of the goods as bailee for the Company provided that if the buyer is purchasing the goods for resale the buyer may as agent for the Company sell and deliver the goods to a third party in the ordinary course of the buyer's business on condition that until such payment as aforesaid the buyer shall hold all proceeds of such sales in trust for the company and in a separate account.

(b) The Company reserves the right to uplift goods supplied if payment is not received after one month's notice has been given to the buyer and for this purpose the buyer hereby grants an irrevocable right and licence to the Company's servants and agents to enter upon all or any of its premises with or without vehicles during normal business hours. Deliveries will be free to unshaded areas as shown on the attached map. A 5% delivery charge will apply to deliveries made to all other areas.
12. Collection by Buyer
A 5% discount will apply to goods collected by the buyer. A minimum of 7 working days' notice must be given to the Company prior to collection.
13. References
All new clients are requested to furnish 2 trade references and the name and address of their bank to the Company.
14. Export
Orders in writing will be charged as normal to port of exit. All packing, freight and other incidentals relating to export are charged at cost. Buyers will give full information regarding import regulations and permits to the Company. For all, except bulky, consignments, air transport is recommended. The Company regret that small orders for export are uneconomical and may have to be refused. The Company reserves the right to enforce any rights against the buyer for compensation for frustrated orders.
15. Termination
If the buyer commits any breach of these conditions or shall go into liquidation either voluntary or compulsory or shall enter into any composition with its creditors or shall suffer any distress or execution to be levied on its goods the Company may terminate this contract and refuse to effect further deliveries without any liability for damages.

It is, therefore, with great pleasure that we offer a limited quantity only of **one of the world's rarest plants** which, since its discovery in 1924, has never been available commercially.

The plant is **Xeronema callistemon**



seen here in flower, a rare member of **LILIACEAE** found in the wild only on Poor Knights Islands and on Hen (Taranga) Island off the east coast of North Auckland, New Zealand, on sunny rocks and well drained areas facing the sea up to 300m above sea level.

The plant is frost tender but can be grown as a 'stove' pot plant requiring rich sandy loam and leaf-mould type medium. In its natural habitat it forms clumps of several metres in diameter and has thick, fleshy leaves 60-100cm long × 3.5cm wide. The spectacular flowers will appear in May, June and July in the Northern Hemisphere.

The 20-35cm long racemes are a vivid, bright red with rich tangerine coloured anthers and are held on upright 35-40cm stiff stems.

Xeronema callistemon should survive in the mildest localities of Britain and will be ideal for conservatories.

This plant is a must for plant collectors.
