## From the Editors

Geoffrey Marshall FRIH is a well-known garden designer and horticulturist based in Auckland. Geoffrey shares with us his knowledge and experience of growing exotic orchids outdoors.

Katarina Tawiri is Curator of the Kaitiaki o Te Kohinga Harakeke o Aotearoa - National NZ Flax Collection at Manaaki Whenua - Landcare Research, Lincoln. Katarina follows her ethnobotanical interests to relate her experiences of growing kūmara in the relatively cool climate at Lincoln, Canterbury.

Barry Hancox is a former bookseller in Christchurch who owns a private collection of early New Zealand gardening books and nursery catalogues. He uses his historic collection to explore the social history of gardening. Here, Barry traces the rise in popularity of native plants in New Zealand

Patricia (Pat) Stuart passed away 8th September 2021. Pat became an Associate of Honour of the RNZIH in 1999, and with her late husband Keith developed several horticultural businesses and an outstanding garden in Wanaka. Pat and Keith's long lives in horticulture are recorded by Murray Dawson and Ken Telford.

Graeme Platt of Auckland passed away 1st October 2021. Graeme was a notable plantsman and ecologist, known for his forthright views and humanitarian values. Graeme delivered the Banks Memorial lecture in 2001 and received the RNZIH Plant Raisers' Award in 2011. Jack Hobbs and Rosemary Platt provide their remembrances of Graeme.
