Garden History Award (Award in Horticultural History and Conservation)

Allan Ross Ferguson

Dr A.R. (Ross) Ferguson has a long and distinguished association with the Royal New Zealand Institute of Horticulture, serving as vice president, and becoming an Associate of Honour in 1998.

He is perhaps the only person to have presented the prestigious Banks Memorial Lecture twice, on topics of horticultural history. In his 2008 lecture, "Sir Joseph Banks and the transfer of crop plants", Dr Ferguson provided a fascinating account of botanist Joseph Banks and his efforts to bring new crops to Britain and its colonies. In 2019 he presented "The domestication and successful commercialisation of kiwifruit". This second lecture summarised a series of his papers, providing a detailed account of the domestication of the kiwifruit from when it was a wild plant in China to where it is today. an important fruit plant in many countries. This story is of particular relevance to New Zealand since it was in this country that the kiwifruit first became a commercial crop. His papers describe the various steps in the kiwifruit's domestication. It is

most unusual for almost every step between wild plant and commercial crop to be known and his study of kiwifruit domestication is now recognised as a definitive account. Several of his more specific kiwifruit papers have appeared in the RNZIH New Zealand Garden Journal, e.g., a biography of Hayward Wright, selector of the kiwifruit cultivar most widely grown throughout the world, and an account of the renaming of the Chinese gooseberry, as it was called for many years, as the kiwifruit (see references under 'Kiwifruit history').

Dr Ferguson has an interest in botanical art and in florilegia, particularly of the 18th century. An account of the Banks' Florilegium was published in the RNZIH journal several years ago and was republished by the New Zealand Herald as being of general interest. Two more recent papers, on 18th century illustrations of New Zealand plants, have been published in the RNZIH journal (see references under 'Florilegia').

A study of the history of horticulture in New Zealand can be facilitated by examining the activities of individual horticulturists and horticultural researchers. Dr Ferguson has been involved in the preparation of a remarkable number of citations, more than 40, for various RNZIH awards as well as others. Dr Ferguson was not named as a compiler for most of these citations, which we acknowledge here in the list that follows. He has also written comprehensive obituaries for more than ten distinguished horticulturists and horticultural scientists. As a result, their achievements have been placed on permanent record.
